Outing to Mt Wellington. Our last outing for 1983 was to Mt Wellington to find mosses and liverworts. 13 members set off in the alpine heath close to the summit, in very calm, warm conditions. Apart from lichens and mosses we also found many flowering plants including the Tasmanian waratah, the mountain eyebright (Euphrasia), and many sundews on the cushion bushes. Members were disappointed to see the damage caused by rabbits to the cushion bushes due to leaving their droppings repeatedly in the same place. In the fauna line we found a flame robin, some crows, many skinks, caterpillars, insects etc., and one Tasmanian Froglet was caught.

After lunch at Luckmans nut we descended to the pipeline track between Chimney Pot Hill Rd and Ferntree, by the magnificent sandstone aqueducts. Birdlife abounded, and several of those noticed were silvereyes, golden whistlers, the flame robin, grey fantail, pink robin and Tasmanian thornbill.

By the side of the track were countless bird orchids (Chiloglottis gunii) in flower, and leaves of several greenhood orchid leaves. The fitter members of the party then went up into thick scrub just below Fillinger St turnoff to investigate the remains of another, much older aqueduct. A great variety of mosses and liverworts were observed on this track.


