EASTER CAMP - 1953.

This includes transport of all luggage and return fares to the camp for those who use the buses chartered by the Club. Members are reminded that Camp Fees are payable in advance.

All heavy luggage must be delivered to 33 Mortimer Av., New Town, not later than Friday, 27 March 1953. Only personal luggage (toilet gear etc.) should be taken on the bus. Heavy luggage includes all suit cases, blankets, rucksacks, camp stretchers, etc., and should be labelled with the owner's name and marked "Field Naturalists' Club Camp". The advance party will leave with this luggage and camp gear on Monday, 30 March 1953.

The Main Party will assemble at 21 Elizabeth St., at 7.30 p.m. on Thursday, 2nd April, and Camp should be reached about 10 p.m.

Remember, there is no time like the present, and if you intend to go please let Mr. Sargison know immediately. This is necessary so that suitable arrangements can be made for catering, etc. Once the quota of 60 is reached it will be too late.
